- **C. Proposed Water Supply Project:** The proposed water supply project will be receiving some federal funding. The City of Hendrum has submitted its SEARCH grant application to help pay for the engineering needed to apply for financial assistance if the City moves ahead with connecting to the rural water supply.
- **D.** Elementary School: The school building is getting its information added to a national database which will market the property for redevelopment purposes. The intent is to appeal to a wider audience looking for space.
 - There has been no update on receiving a repair quote for the gymnasium roof.
 - There has been community interest in helping to provide additional open gym availability. The Council approved setting up an open gym committee and appointed Councilmember Smart as the liaison.

MOTION: B. Schlapkohl moved; seconded by *P. Baukol* to authorize an open gym committee for the purpose of scheduling additional available times for open gym and to appoint Councilmember Smart as the liaison between the committee and the city.

- Entries for the "Name the Building" contest have been narrowed down to five entries and the Authority will be requesting public input before submitting the options for consideration of approval by the City Council.

A. 222 Canning St E Zoning Request: A public hearing was conducted during the March 20th meeting of the Hendrum Economic Development Authority meeting concerning the intention to adopt an amendment to the Official Zoning Map of the City of Hendrum, Minnesota, Planning & Zoning (Land Use) Ordinance No. 74 to change the zoning district from Residential to dual zoned Residential and Commercial. The Authority recommended adopting the amended Official Zoning Map.

MOTION: B. Schlapkohl moved; seconded by *M. Smart* to adopt the amendment to the Official Zoning Map that changes the zoning district on Lots 19 to 24 in Block 1 of Whites First Addition to the City of Hendrum, Norman County, Minnesota to Residential and Commercial.

B. Donation: A donation from Lee Township was offered to be used in support of the Hendrum Rescue Squad services. The Council was appreciative of the donors' intent and accepted the donation offered.
