Regular Council Meeting Minutes

April 12, 2021

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Johannsen called to order the regular meeting of the City of Hendrum Council at 7:33 pm on April 12, 2021, in the Hendrum Civic Center located at 309 Main Street East in Hendrum, Minnesota. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

- **C. MAYOR:** Mayor Johannsen proclaimed May to be Beautification and Tree Planting Month in the City of Hendrum.
- **D. FIRE DEPARTMENT:** The fire department used one of the Hendrum Economic Development Authority owned houses that will be scheduled for destruction to conduct search and rescue training.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. City Ordinance Violations: It has been reported to the city that a violation has occurred regarding Ordinance No. 67 (Animal Control), Section 7b. (Animal Wastes on Public and Private Property). Clerk-Treasurer Plemmons was instructed by the city council to send a violation notice to the dog owners.

MOTION: P. Baukol moved; seconded by *M. Smart* to send a notice of ordinance violation to the property owners at 252 Herbert Street South regarding animal waste being deposited on private property.

- C. Wellhead Protection: No update.
- **D. Proposed Water Supply Project:** A rural water district representative is tentatively scheduled for the June meeting to present more information regarding the proposed project to the council.
- E. NCW Elementary School: The "Save the Building" committee has submitted a property acquisition proposal to the city council for consideration. The proposal for property acquisition includes all the Norman County West Elementary School property within the City of Hendrum including all the buildings and grounds, bus shed, football field, basketball courts, and playground equipment. The request also includes all the kitchen, food service, and cafeteria equipment; all the gymnasium equipment including the wood floor, basketball backboards, scoreboards, PA sound system, stage lights and curtains, bleachers, folding chairs and tables, composite pictures, trophies and plaques; any structurally attached equipment including lockers, storage cabinets in the cafeteria lobby, trophy cases, phones,

intercom, cameras and security system, an automatic floor scrubber for building maintenance, and; financial assistance to help maintain the building and grounds for a reasonable amount of time to allow for repurposing. John Kolness and Jeannette Wenshau who served as members of the "Save the Building" committee were in attendance to provide input and feedback regarding the proposal. Discussion also took place on usage scenarios for the property including alternatives to consider if a feasible usage cannot be found.

MOTION: B. Schlapkohl moved; seconded by *P. Baukol* to submit the property acquisition proposal as presented for consideration to the Norman County West school board.

F. Seasonal Help: Six applications were received for the Seasonal Maintenance Assistant position. The council discussed that they would only need to hire one assistant for the summer position.

MOTION: P. Baukol moved; seconded by *B. Schlapkohl* to close the meeting to the public at 8:48 pm as permitted by Minnesota Statute 13.43 to discuss information regarding the job applications which contain private data.

After reviewing the applications, the council discussed hiring an individual who has previous work experience and a proven reliable track record as a seasonal employee with the city and who also has experience operating large equipment such as the batwing mower.

- **G. Surplus Items Online Auction:** A date was set by members of the EDA to view and finalize a list of items from the EDA-owned properties to be brought to the council as potential surplus property for an online auction. Some city-owned items will also be added to the list.
- **H.** American Rescue Plan: The estimated allocation from the American Rescue Plan to the City of Hendrum is approximately thirty-two thousand dollars. The funds will be released in two payments to local governments, with half following enactment and half paid 12 months following receipt of first payment.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Sidewalk Flowers: The Hendrum EDA is requesting an increase to the budgeted expenditure for flowers since there are additional barrel planters to fill and has also requested that the proposed expenditure of one thousand dollars be split between the EDA and the city.

MOTION: P. Baukol moved; seconded by *B. Schlapkohl* to approve splitting the approximately one-thousand-dollar expense for soil and flowers to fill the barrel planters with the EDA.

B. Building Permits: A building permit application was received from American Waterworks to install draintile, sump, vapor barrier, and GeoLock earth anchors at 403 Gordon Street East.

MOTION: S. Jeffery moved; seconded by *B. Schlapkohl* to issue a building permit for 403 Gordon Street East.

A building permit application was received from Dan Hart to construct a porch on an existing cement slab.

MOTION: M. Smart moved; seconded by *P. Baukol* to issue a building permit for 354 Rice Street South. BAUKOL: *aye*; JEFFERY: *aye*; JOHANNSEN: *aye*; SCHLAPKOHL: *aye*; SMART: *aye*. *MOTION PASSED*.

C. Donation: One donation was received from Lee Township to be used for Hendrum Rescue Squad expenses.

MOTION: M. Smart moved; seconded by *B. Schlapkohl* to adopt Resolution No. 2021-07: Resolution Accepting Donations. On the following roll call vote the resolution was duly adopted and on file at the City Clerk's office.

D. Tree Program: The City has allocated funds to reimburse residents for one-half of the purchase price up to twenty dollars per tree for up to two trees per property to be planted within the limits of the City of Hendrum.

MOTION: B. Schlapkohl moved; seconded by *M. Smart* to continue the Hendrum Tree Planting Program for 2021.
