2015 CLEAN-UP DAY

May 12, 2015

Just a reminder to residents: This will be the only Clean-Up Day scheduled for 2015. Please have everything set out on your boulevard by 5:30 AM. Stickers will need to be purchased from the City Office for all appliances, computer monitors, and televisions intended to be picked up. Rates are as follows:

\$20.00 Appliances with Freon

\$15.00 Non-Freon Appliances

\$15.00 Computer Monitors and TVs

Items that will NOT be picked up include:

Tires Hazardous Waste Fuel
Gasoline Used Oil Sheetrock
Paint Cans with Paint in them
Leaves and Branches
Large Quantities of Lumber
Computer Monitors and TVs **WITHOUT** a sticker

CITY RESIDENTS: DO NOT DISPOSE OF ANYTHING AT THE HENDRUM TOWNSHIP DUMPSTER. The Township will prosecute those for illegal dumping as the dumpster is for township residents only

RECYCLING DUMPSTERS: The recycling dumpsters are located on the north side of the NCW Elementary School and the west side of town near the corner of Quincy and the North side of Main Street. The glass, plastic, tin cans and newspapers do not need to be separated.

BRANCH & LEAF PICK-UP: Open burning is *not allowed* in the city. Branches and leaves will be picked up the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month (May through September) and each Thursday during the month of October, weather permitting. All branches **MUST BE CUT** small enough for one person to handle. Leaves and grass clippings need to be bagged and placed on the boulevard for pick-up along with the branches. **Branches and bags of leaves will not be picked up if they are too large, heavy or difficult to handle.**

COUNTY WIDE CLEAN UP EVENT

Norman County will be holding their annual County Wide Clean-Up Event.

May 7 – 10:00 am to 2:00 pm – Fluorescent Light Bulb and Battery Collection at the Norman County Highway Department in Ada.

May 7 – 2:00 pm to 5:30 pm – Household Hazardous Waste and Ag Pesticide Collection will be located in the Norman County Highway Department parking lot in Twin Valley.

May 7-9 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm – Norman County Environmental Services along with the Norman County Demolition Landfill will be holding a White and Brown Goods Collection. The landfill is located 5 miles west on County Highway 19 from State Hwy 32 or 7 miles east on County Hwy 19 from State Hwy 9.

TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

The City of Hendrum is proclaiming May as Beautification Month and in support is continuing the Hendrum Tree Planting Program. There are a few changes to the program this year. The City of Hendrum is encouraging citizens to plant trees from May 1st until June 30th. Purchase up to **two trees** from a supplier of your choice and the City will reimburse residents for ½ of the purchase price of the trees or up to \$20.00 per tree.

The City has allocated funds for this program and is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Interested residents **must plant trees within the City of Hendrum.**

What you need to do to participate: Purchase your trees between May 1, 2015 and June 30, 2015, and bring your receipt to the Hendrum City Clerk's Office to qualify for a reimbursement check. Again, there are limited dollars and this offer is on a first come, first serve basis. When the money runs out, so does the offer. All receipts must be turned in by July 15, 2015, to qualify for reimbursement.

Please make sure to take advantage of this opportunity to get new trees planted in our community!



2015 Pet Clinic

**May 14, 2015 5- 7 PM
Hendrum Civic Center**

Dr. Randall Lindemann of Frazee, MN, will be at the Civic Center to administer rabies shots, and distemper shots for cats and dogs. The vet will also have medications/vaccinations for lyme disease and leukemia. Flea & tick and heartworm preventatives will also be available.

All pet licenses will need to be purchased or renewed for 2015. Both cats and dogs are required to be licensed. Licenses will be valid through May 31, 2015.

The licensing fees are as follows:

- Spayed or neutered pets is \$4
- Intact is \$5

If you prefer to take your pet somewhere else, please remember that the City requires proof of vaccination for rabies and proof that the animal has been spayed or neutered.



JUNKED OR ABANDONED VEHICLES

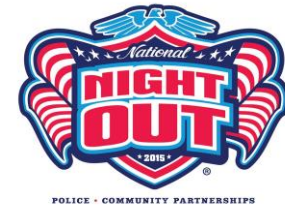
If any resident has a junked and/or abandoned vehicle that you wish to dispose of, please contact Mike Smart to make arrangements to have the vehicle towed at no expense to the owner.

Motorized Vehicles are NOT ALLOWED on the dike!

ATV Operation: Minnesota state laws require all ATV riders under the age of 18 on public land to wear a helmet at all times. ATV registration is required for public and private land use through the DNR. A driver's license is required to operate an ATV along or on public road rights-of-way. No operator under 12 can cross public roads or drive on public roads and lands. Operators between 12 and 15 must have a safety training certificate and be accompanied by an adult 18 or older who possesses a driver's license to operate on public lands. Anyone born after 1987 must also have a safety training certificate. A rider may not operate an ATV on a trail designated "not for motorized use," posted public lands, state park lands, wildlife management areas, or unfrozen water.

TORNADO ALLEY

In Minnesota, nearly 75% of all tornadoes have occurred during the months of May, June and July. We lie along the northern edge of the country known as Tornado Alley. The number of injuries and fatalities has been decreasing due to better tools in detecting and alerting the public. As part of the alert system, there is a warning siren located in the city of Hendrum. The siren is tested the first Wednesday of every month to make sure it is working. During times of weather indicating tornadic activity, the siren is set off with a straight signal to warn residents who are outside to immediately take cover. At other times, the siren will be set off to alert the Fire and Rescue Department Volunteers that they have received an emergency call for assistance. This warning signal is identifiable by an oscillating (up and down) sound.

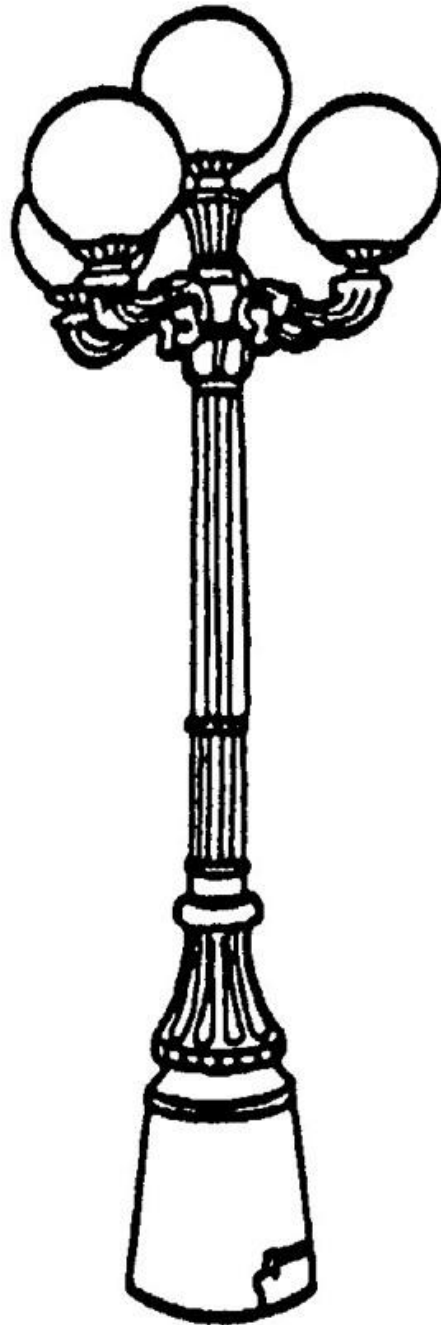

LOCAL BOARD OF APPEAL & TAX EQUALIZATION MEETING

April 30, 2015; 6:00 PM: Hendrum City Hall. The purpose of this meeting is to determine whether taxable property in the jurisdiction has been properly valued and classified by the assessor, and to determine whether corrections need to be made. If you believe the value or classification of your property is incorrect, please contact your assessor's office to discuss your concerns. If you are still not satisfied with the valuation or classification after discussing it with your assessor, you may appear before the local board of appeal and equalization. The board shall review the valuation, classification, or both if necessary, and shall correct it as needed. Generally, an appearance before your local board of appeal and equalization is required by law before an appeal can be taken to the county board of appeal and equalization.
